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## Donna's Lifesaving Journey

Donna S. works full time to support herself. She is 58 years old and when the opportunity arose to get a mammogram at a low cost in October 2010, she grabbed it since she had no health insurance.

There was no history of breast cancer in her family. When she heard the words "There is something suspicious on your film; you need to have this looked into," she was overwhelmed. As Donna tells the story, "It was scary from two standpoints: first because of the diagnosis and second because I had no insurance."

Luckily for Donna, a nurse navigator at the community health center where she was diagnosed knew about Gateway to Hope and made the life-saving referral. Donna believes that without GTH "I would have ridden it out and taken my chances." Not a very good option!

Donna was very distraught for a number of reasons. She already owed over \$8,000 for the biopsy. And on a very personal level she talked about her husband who had died two years ago and now she did not have him for the support she so desperately wanted and needed. However, she is grateful for the loving support of her two daughters, son and extended family.

GTH arranged her treatment which included a lumpectomy at St. Mary's Health Center under the skillful hands of Dr. Stephanie Schnepf followed by radiation therapy treatments with Dr. Humberto Fagundes at Missouri Baptist Cancer Center. Follow-up visits were coordinated with Dr. Jason Li at Gateway to Hope's new partner and provider, Parkland Health Center, Bonne Terre, which was terrific for Donna since it was closer to her home in Marquand, Missouri.

As she looks back on her experience, Donna is extremely appreciative of the care she received especially the fact that "I was never looked down on because I was uninsured and not eligible for government assistance. The physicians answered all my questions and explained the treatment in considerable detail." Particularly meaningful to her was that her daughters arranged for friends to help with the two hour drive back and forth for the twice-a-day radiation treatments which she had for 5 days.

**Donna says, "I wish more people knew about GTH and the relief one feels when the tremendous financial burden is taken away which then helps with the emotional stress associated with finding out you have breast cancer."**

It is frequently said that “Lightning never strikes in the same place twice.” However, I began to doubt the validity of that myth when my recent routine mammogram once again was not routine. Breast cancer was back.

Dr. Marlys Schuh (co-founder of Gateway to Hope) had the unfortunate task of telling me the news. As I sat there in her office – totally stunned – my mind was racing.

And then I looked her straight in the eye and said: “What I am thinking is how lucky I am to have access to doctors who will help me through this journey once again. And – in one of those moments of total clarity – I thought about our patients and the fact that lightning strikes twice with them when they hear “You have cancer.” That's the first strike. The second is the realization that they either have no insurance or are underinsured. And until they discovered Gateway to Hope, they had a very uncertain future.

Now, fast-forward to our recent GTH Golf Tournament.

Following dinner, Beth W. shared her breast cancer journey with everyone. Although Beth felt she was not good at public speaking, her story was delivered eloquently. She stated “I wished I had been asked to bake apple pies for everyone, I know I do that very well.”

Beth explained as small business owners, she and her husband were unable to afford private medical insurance. When Beth discovered a lump in her breast, they quickly realized that the treatment necessary would deplete their savings. They paid out of pocket for the initial mammogram and her mastectomy. Beyond that, they found they would not be able to afford the next steps in her treatment.

Fortunately they were referred to Gateway to Hope. Through our partnership with Missouri Baptist Hospital, Beth's chemotherapy was provided at the Sullivan Missouri location. Not only would this treatment save her life, but would eliminate the 120 mile round trip drive to St. Louis.

When Beth finished speaking everyone rose to their feet for a standing ovation. It's one thing to hear our mission statement; it's quite another to hear a real story from the person who lived it.

My hope is that Beth's story and the stories of more than

225 GTH patients will inspire you to continue your support of this outstanding and unique organization. It isn't often we have the opportunity to save a life – literally! It's an unbelievable feeling – not only for the patients – but for YOU who make it possible. And for that I thank you – and so does each and every grateful patient!
